After we receive your nomination, an e-mail will be sent directly to the nominated students containing information about the school, required documents, housing etc. International students will be offered to purchase life insurance through HUJI, or can choose to provide their own insurance policy in advance.</p>																														
<p>Programs and Courses</p>	<p>Exchange students will be able to choose their courses from 2 faculties: 1- The School of Business Administration 2- The Rothberg International School (RIS) Further details about courses will be provided to nominated students.</p>

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<p>Language of Instruction</p>	<p>In the Business school, there will be approximately 8 courses taught in English per semester (Graduate and Undergraduate). In RIS, all courses will be taught in English.</p>																														
<p>Services available to exchange students</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The International dept. at the Business School provides student advising and support from day 1 (nomination) and throughout the entire exchange term. - RIS will provide support on all admin. and registration issues. - The Office of Student Activities (OSA) is responsible for organizing diverse extracurricular programs specifically designed to introduce students to the Land of Israel – its people, geography, culture and politics. The many exciting events, tours and activities that complement the academic program allow participants to see the country from new angles and provide them with a comprehensive, memorable Israel experience. 																														

Housing	<p>Students will be able to choose to live in the Student Village (cost is approx. 600 euro/month). An application for housing will be sent to nominees. It is strongly recommended to choose this option.</p> <p>*Students must bring or purchase blankets, sheets, pillowcases, towels, and pillows as they are not supplied.</p>
Facilities on-Premise of Student Village (Droms)	<p>Restaurant, Bar, free wifi access, Student's lounge, laundromat, convenience store. 2 minute walk to shopping center, bus and light-rail stations.</p>
Student Visa	<p>All students who are planning to arrive in Israel for an exchange term must acquire a multiple-entry A/2 student visa from the Israeli Consulate in their country of residence.</p>
Arrival Date	<p>We recommend student's arrive 2-3 days before classes begin.</p>
Orientation Day	<p>Students will be required to attend an orientation session and will be informed about it prior to their arrival by the International Office.</p>
Buddies	<p>The Buddy program is a new initiative in which we will assign local Business Administration students to accompany our incoming exchange students during their term in Israel.</p>
